Abundance or extensive in quantity.

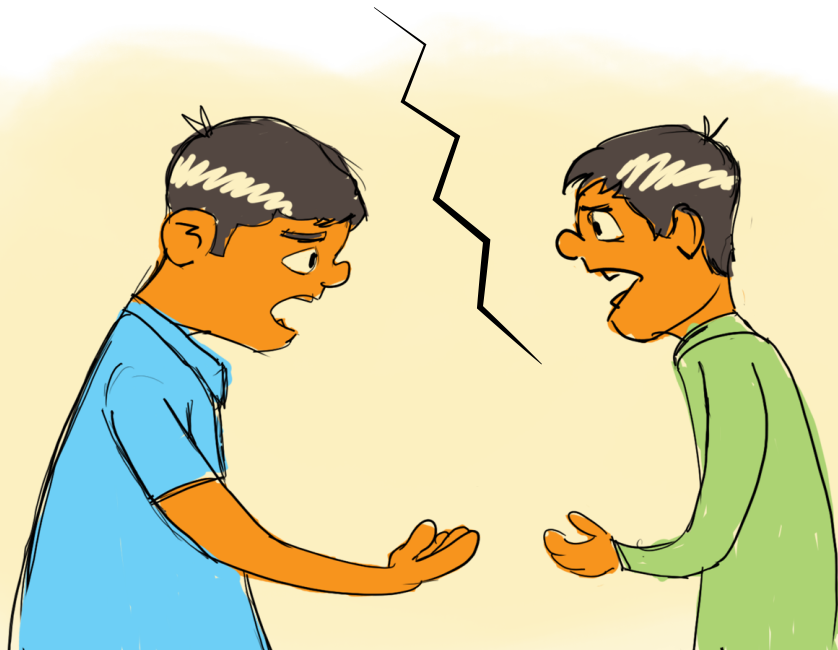


There were copious amounts of refreshments available at the beach.

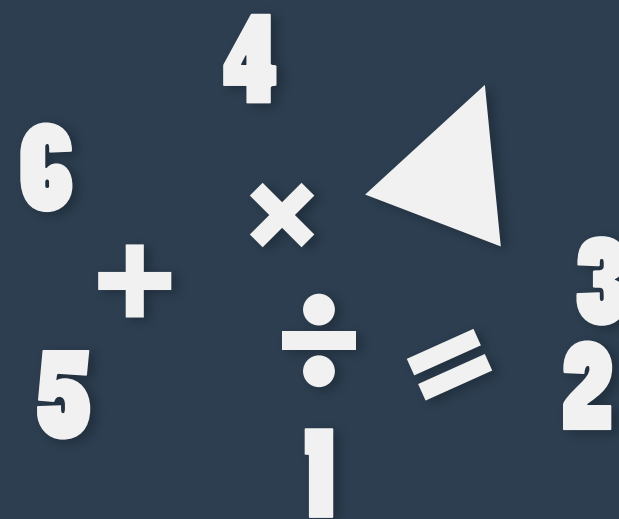

No, my sport is better!!

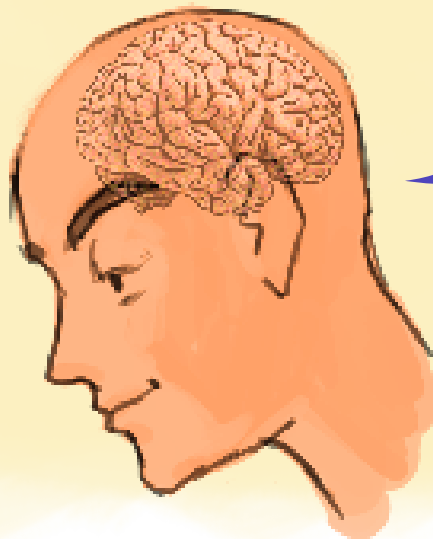


There is a schism between Dev and Ben.



# Cognitive (Adjective)

# Cognizant

(Adjective)

To be aware of something.

# Fallible

(Adjective)

# Connotation

(Noun)

Suggestion of an additional meaning for a word or expression, apart from its explicit meaning.
